Applying for your Nescot Bursary Online 2025/26 Academic Year

Step 1 – Create a bursary account

Using the middle boxes to create your bursary account by inserting:

- Your student number (without the “S” and “0” so 212345)
- Your Date of Birth
- The password you would like to use for the Bursary Portal
- Your confirmed password
- Click Register

PLEASE NOTE:

YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO CREATE A BUSARY ACCOUNT UNTIL YOU HAVE ENROLLED ON YOUR COURSE FOR THE 2025/26 ACADEMIC YEAR. OUR THRESHOLD FOR THIS YEAR IS HOUSEHOLD INCOME OF £30,000 OR LESS.

Step 2 – Activate your bursary account

Once you have registered your account you will be sent an activation link please use this link to activate your account. Please do this immediately, the link does not last forever.

Step 3 – Log in to your Bursary Account and Apply for your Bursary

When your account is activated you can then log in (the right hand box) using your Nescot ID number (without the “S” and “0”), your date of birth and the password that you used to set up your bursary account.

Please then answer the questions and upload the evidence to submit your bursary application.

BURSARY EVIDENCE GUIDE

Guide to residency and income evidence required for your Bursary application.

Residency

- Copy of current Passport
- UK Birth Certificate
- Share Code (if non UK national)

Household Income

Wage Slips

- Last 3 months wage slips for each working adult in household

Self Employed

- Self-Assessment Tax Return for 24/25

Universal Credit

- All pages of your most recent UC statement. This must include all the following sections.
 - » Name and Address
 - » What are you entitled to
 - » What we take off (deductions)

You will need to print these details from your online UC account or provide screenshots.

Other Benefits:

- Income Support
- Jobseekers Allowance
- ESA
- State Pension Credit

All pages of award letter dated within the last 3 months.

Non Means Tested Benefits

If you are in receipt of non means tested benefits such as PIP, DLA or Carer's allowance: These are not sufficient evidence on their own. They can be used along with UC or wage slips as proof of income with extenuating circumstances.

Bank Details

Student bank details required. We are unable to make payments into parent's accounts.
